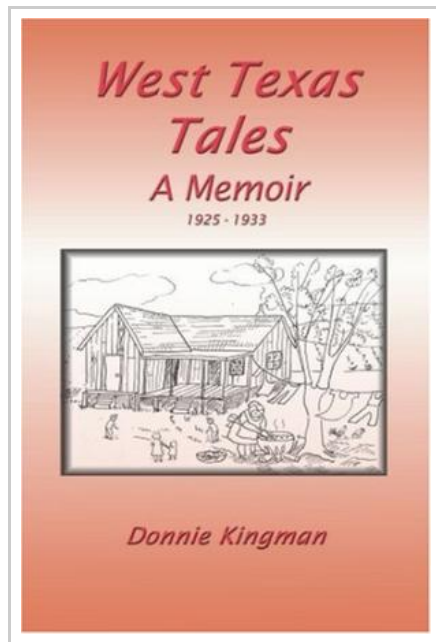




West Texas Tales: 1925-1933

Lessons learned at school, picking cotton and wishing for rain are a part of life. Coping with a family tragedy, a tornado and crop loss, the family never loses hope for a better life.
